FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY BEGINS WITH FOCUS AND SETTING PRIORITIES

“Governor Pawlenty demonstrated excellent judgment in fiscal responsibility by axing “The Pond” on Thursday night,” says Eva Ng, Saint Paul Mayoral Candidate.

“During an economic downturn, a good local leader should let his or her executive skills shine by balancing the budget the people have given him or her to work with. When that job is done, he or she should be a team player and find ways to help lighten the burden at the state level. We Minnesotans are all in this together. What Saint Paul can do to help the state will eventually come back to benefit Saint Paul,” Eva Ng advises.
